	 Other Projects & Activities Distillery Update: All legal formalities for the lease have been completed, and it became active on 1st May 2025. An invoice for the first year's rent (£4,800) has been issued in advance to The Thompson Brothers. The project remains on course for the sale of the land in 2026. A change in routing for the electric supply was confirmed — now avoiding the full length of the site next to the MUGA. SSEN will carry out the works. A deed of servitude is required for the entry and exit points of the supply line across DACIC land. All associated legal and installation costs will be covered by the distillery. Sports Centre and Community Centre Update: The project is currently on hold pending the outcome of the public consultation regarding TRACC. If TRACC closes completely, this may impact the suitability of the site due to anticipated user volume. Additionally, a recent article in <i>The Northern Times</i> by David Anderson unexpectedly outlined plans for the Meadows, which may also affect both the sports and community centre proposals. It was agreed that PM will arrange a meeting between DADCA, DACIC and David Anderson to clarify each group's plans and ensure coordination moving forward.
